	North and South Poles	The North and South poles are at the top and bottom of the globe. They have extremely cold weather all year round because they don't get much sunlight.
	Equator	The equator is an imaginary line that runs around the middle of the globe and it where the weather is the hottest.

Key Vocabulary	Definition
Village	A type of settlement where people live near one another and share local services and facilities
Town	An area with streets, houses, and buildings that is larger than a village but usually smaller than a city.
City	A large and permanent human settlement.
Country	An area of land with boundaries which fits within a continent. Countries have their own villages, towns and cities.
Continent	A continent is a large area of land that is separated from others by water or other natural features.
Ocean	A huge body of salt water (sea).
