What? Key Knowledge Takeaways

- The Industrial Revolution began in 1760 and finished around 1840.
- During the Industrial Revolution lots of new machines were invented so large factories were built to manufacture lots of different items quickly.
- Halesowen became famous for its coal and nail making, Cradley for its chain making and Walsall for its saddle making.
- Our local area was rich in coal and there was a lot of thick black smoke, soot and pollution from the factories, it therefore become known as The Black Country.
- During the Industrial Revolution poor children would often work in the factories and workhouses whereas rich children would go to school.
- The Victorian era is named after the reigning queen- Queen Victoria
- The Victorian era was between 1837 and 1901.
- Queen Victoria changed working conditions and introduced that all children must attend school.

Charles Dickens	A famous author who wrote 'Oliver Twist'.				
Isambard Kingdom Brunel	A famous engineer who played a key role the industrial revolution. He designed and constructed railway lines, bridges, tunnels and docks around the country.				
William Shenstone	He was a poet and one of the earliest landscape gardens through the development of The Leasowes.
